“THE POINT WITHIN THE CIRCLE.”

As is stated in the dictionary of Freemasonry by Robert Macoy, the definition of symbolical is that “Freemasonry being confessedly an allegorical system, all its points, parts, and secrets must partake in common of its emblematical construction. Every doctrine and ceremony has its mystical references. – Every landmark its legitimate explanation. But there are often more important antitypes than those which are commonly assigned, and though they do not appear on the surface, are nevertheless worthy of our serious consideration. Hence arises the necessity, in these times of scientific and philosophical research, of maintaining Freemasonry in its proper rank, by investigating the tendency of its numerous details, that we may correctly ascertain whether their import be uniform, and their typical reference valuable.”¹ As per this definition we can see that the further study of its symbols must be researched to find it’s deeper and correct meaning as Symbols can have many different interpretations to different cultures, groups, civilizations and religions. The discussion here will describe how the point within the circle in ancient times was to represent God.

The point within a circle was called by Pythagoras the Monad and was his God or the one that is everything. In the Secret Teachings of All Ages, Manly P. Hall writes “He described God as the Supreme Mind distributed throughout all parts of the universe – the Cause of all things, the Intelligence of all things and the Power within all things.”² Pythagoras of Samos lived from 570bc to 495bc. He was an Ionian Greek philosopher, mathematician and founder of this philosophical movement called Pythagoreanism.

We see closer to our time where the Monad is discussed once more. Gottfried Wilhelm von Leibniz (July 1, 1646- November 1716) which was a German mathematician and philosopher. He believed that matter reduced to its ultimate particles cease to exist as a substantial body, being resolved into a mass of immaterial ideas or metaphysical units of power, to which Leibnitz called “Monad”³. All things were considered to him to consist of single Monads of varying magnitudes or of aggregations of bodies. To him all of these exist as physical, emotional, mental, or spiritual substances. The first and greatest Monad was God.

We have learned in the Entered Apprentice lecture that “there is represented in every regular and well governed Lodge, a certain point within a circle - the point representing an individual Brother; the circle, the boundary-line of his conduct toward God and man; beyond which he is never to suffer his passions, prejudices or interests to betray him, on any occasion”. In my opinion if we take this interpretation and borrow the interpretations of Pythagoras which was similarly borrowed from Leibniz take our explanation of the Monad a lot further than our explanation. We can put ourselves as a Monad since we are a piece of the greatest Monad which is God. This is where our teaching of morality can be taken further to the point which if our goal is to be as pure and perfect as God we are to try to stay in the point within the circle and if we let our passions, prejudices or interest get in our way we will defray from the center of the circle. Therefore no longer being in the center of it and letting ourselves to be overcome by imperfection.

VETERANS SALUTE BILL S.1877

AN ACT

To amend title 4, United States Code, to prescribe that members of the Armed Forces and Veterans out of uniform may render the military salute during hoisting, lowering, or passing of flag.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

SECTION 1. Conduct by members of the Armed Forces and Veterans out of uniform during Hoisting, Lowering, or passing of Flag.

Section 9 of Title 4, United States Code, is amended by striking "all persons present" and all that follows through the end and inserting "those present in uniform should render the military salute. Members of the Armed Forces and Veterans who are present but not in uniform may render the military salute. All other persons present should face the flag and stand at attention with their right hand over the heart, or if applicable, remove their headdress with their right hand and hold it at the left shoulder, the hand being over the heart. Citizens of other countries should at attention. All such conduct toward the flag in a moving column should be rendered at the moment the flag passes."

Brother Nagy Entered into Freemasonry in 2001. Having been Prepared in his heart for many years before Entering, he quickly embraced the Tenants of Freemasonry and engaged in several Lodge support activities while learning what he could about the Craft. Brother John steadily progressed through the Symbolic Degrees, earned his White Lambskin Apron and proceeded to support Lodge Degree activities. Immediately following his initial experiences of the Junior Warden's chair, he found himself migrating toward providing Music for Lodge Communications and Degrees along with providing continuing Masonic Education as his expressed Masonic passions. His offerings were favorably noticed and because he provided a wide variety of Masonic Education pieces, his Lodge Brothers encouraged him to consolidate his Work into a book that could be shared with Brothers around the world. That effort was eventually named "Building Hiram – Uncommon Catechism for Uncommon Masonic Education – Volume 1." With its successful creation, publication and distribution, Volumes 2, 3 and 4, quickly followed Volume 1. Those volumes are now collectively referred to as "The Building Series."

In between his research, writing and publication of these books, John also co-authored another book, "Lifting the Veil – Esoteric Masonic Thought", a collection of esoteric Masonic writings by Masonic authors from around the world. Additionally, Brother Nagy has published numerous Masonic Education articles that have appeared in "Further Light Magazine", Lodgeroom International Magazine, The Working Tools Magazine and on his Masonic Web-log, "Building Builders." He has been interviewed live on several webcasts (Masonic Central, Freemason Information) on his Works. He is currently featured as one of the Intenders on the "Worldwide Exemplification of Freemasonry" project supported by the Grand Lodge of Indiana. That feature is called "The Coaches Coach: Building Builders" and it is based on the research behind his Building Series of books.

Brother John is a North American Freemason who practices Freemasonry within the Jurisdiction of the State of Florida in the South-Eastern United States. He is a perpetual member of Tampa Bay Lodge No. 252 and a lifetime member of the Florida Lodge of Research No. 999. He continues to provide Music to his two Lodges as their Lodge Musician and provides occasional Masonic Education to a select group of other Lodges as time permits. Upon request, Brother Nagy also facilitates Masonic Education Workshops based upon his research and writings.
